Purpose	These forms are used to start a Domestic Violence Restraining Order. Domestic Violence Restraining Orders are used when you need protection from someone you dated or had an intimate relationship with, including a spouse or domestic partner. It can also be against a relative if they are your child, parent, sibling, or grandparent. This includes in-laws.
