REMOTE TECHNOLOGY BY MANDATORY
SETTLEMENT CONFERENCE JUDGE

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
NO. 24.02

For all civil cases subject to Code of Civil Procedure section 367.75, Rule 10.635 of the California Rules of Court prescribes when a judicial officer may preside remotely over a proceeding from a location other than a courtroom. As Mandatory Settlement Conferences are routinely conducted remotely between the parties and the court, in the interest of justice, the Presiding Judge approves the use of remote technology to conduct Mandatory Settlement Conferences from chambers. Mandatory Settlement Conferences will be conducted remotely from chambers when no participants appear in person.

THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2024. IT WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE.
